

NEW ZEALAND ITINERARY FOR
25 Days Christchurch to Auckland

Day 1 **ARRIVE AUCKLAND – CHRISTCHURCH**

Arrive in Auckland on flight (details to be advised).

After claiming your luggage (carts are available free of charge) and completing Customs and Immigration formalities, exit the Customs Hall where you will be met by an ID New Zealand representative and be transferred to the domestic terminal for your flight to Christchurch (details to be advised).

On arrival in Christchurch, you will collect your rental vehicle from the Christchurch Airport Depot.

The drive to Otahuna Lodge is approximately 20 minutes.

Stay at: ***Otahuna Lodge in a Standard Suite***
Includes; pre dinner drinks and canapés, dinner and wine pairing, and breakfast.

Christchurch is the South Island's largest city. Sprawling out across the Canterbury Plains, Christchurch was incorporated as a city in 1862. It was named after the Oxford College attended by John Robert Godley, leader of the settlers arriving in the first four ships to arrive in Christchurch.

Christchurch is said to be the most English city outside England. The River Avon meanders through the city and its banks provide a popular lunchtime retreat. Cathedral Square is a place to relax and take in the proportions of the stone-built Cathedral.

The city has a backdrop of the Southern Alps and long, ocean beaches are only a short drive away. The Port Hills are well worth a visit, for the dramatic views they give of the surrounding areas.

The Port of Lyttelton and Akaroa, the only French settlement in the country are also close by. Christchurch is a charming city, a garden city with many parks within its bounds. Most notable is Hagley Park (200ha). Pride of the city is the impressive Town Hall, a modern structure and the Queen Elizabeth II Park Stadium built for the 1974 Commonwealth Games.

The rest of your afternoon is at leisure.

Day 2 **CHRISTCHURCH**

Today you will have a full day at leisure.

There are a great deal of things you can do today however (due to the distance you have travelled) it is recommended that you wait until you have arrived to make plans. The lodge staff are very knowledgeable and will be able to assist you in making any bookings.

Day 3 **CHRISTCHURCH – KAIKOURA**

This morning drive to Kaikoura, this will take approximately 2 hours, 35 minutes. It is 114 miles.

It is suggested that you stop in the Waipara area where you can enjoy lunch in one of the nearby wineries.

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Day 3 **CHRISTCHURCH – KAIKOURA – continued**

As you arrive in Kaikoura you will travel directly through the town and continue north for about 7 miles crossing over the Hapuku River Bridge and check into your accommodation.

Stay at: ***Hapuku Lodge in a Lodge Suite***
Includes; breakfast

Once you have checked in and set down your bags you will return to the town centre and check in for your Whale Watch tour.

Check in for your Whale watch cruise. You need to allow 3.5 hours for this tour from check in.

The seaside settlement of Kaikoura, situated midway between Christchurch and Picton on the rugged east coast of New Zealand's South Island, is overlooked by majestic mountains, which are snow-capped for many months of the year.

This unique combination of ocean and mountains offers stunning coastal alpine scenery and a host of eco-tourism oriented activities, including Whale watching, Dolphin swimming, walks, and much more.

You may wish to stay in town for a casual dinner tonight or return to the lodge.

Day 4 **KAIKOURA**

After breakfast this morning return to Kaikoura town and the Encounter Kaikoura office.

Check in for your Swimming with the Dolphins tour which departs at 8.30am. This tour is 3 to 3.5 hours long.

You will have time to get lunch in town before your next tour.

Check in for your Albatross Encounter tour which departs at 1.00pm. This tour is 2 to 2.5 hours long.

Day 5 **KAIKOURA – BLENHEIM**

Today it is suggested that you depart early to take full advantage of your day in Blenheim.

Drive to Blenheim takes approximately 1 hour, 50 minutes. It is 80 miles.

On arrival make your way to the Blenheim information centre where you will join your afternoon tour of this wine region.

Depart from the Blenheim information centre.

Head out into the stunning Marlborough wine region for a very enjoyable and informative afternoon of divine wine and food tastings.

Drop off back at the Blenheim information centre.

Following your tour check into your accommodation where you will have dinner tonight.

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Day 5 **KAIKOURA – BLENHEIM** - continued

Stay at: ***Herzog Vineyard Cottage***

Includes; 5-course degustation dinner and a breakfast basket. Plus you will get a personalised tour of the boutique winery and meet the Head Chef.

Blenheim is the capital of Marlborough and is known throughout New Zealand as one of the sunniest towns in the country. One of the highlights is beautiful Pollard Park which has beautiful gardens. There is also Brayshaw Park which is operated by four different organisations known as The Marlborough Historical Society, The Vintage Farm Machinery Society, The Vintage Car Club and The Marlborough Associated Modellers each operating different parts of the park and Beavertown which is a replica of Blenheim's main street from the 1860 era.

The region is known for the wines produced and has a number of very high quality producers who have achieved world-wide recognition.

Day 6 **BLENHEIM – NELSON (VIA PICTON)**

Depart Blenheim

Your drive to Picton is only 25 minutes (17 miles).

Check in for your Eco tour at Waikawa Bay Wharf. This tour departs at 8.00am.

This is a fabulous voyage, a unique Marlborough Sounds experience. Cruise around Cape Jackson, the outermost extremity of Queen Charlotte Sound; witness the thrill of crossing the reef where the Pacific and Cook Strait tides converge, feel the raw power of Mother Nature as it surges around the picturesque lighthouse that clings to an offshore pinnacle. We then steam up into Port Gore, a very isolated, mystical inlet that is steeped in Maori history.

Our first stop is at the old gold mines, hard to believe that men would mine in such a foreboding place. Then on to the site of Kupe's Footprints, where legend says he lived with his family 1000 years ago, and left their footprints behind to bear witness, embedded in granite are men, women, children and dog prints.

Discover the hidden boat harbour, fresh water running down the moss covered rock face, sea food along the rocks and trees that are hundreds of years old. "This is a place that legends are made of, feel the atmosphere."

Return to Picton and continue on to Nelson.

Your drive to Nelson is 1 hour, 35 minutes (68 miles).

On arrival check into your accommodation

Stay at: ***Atholwood—Luxury Country Accommodation in a Suite room***

Includes; breakfast

The rest of your evening is at leisure.

Nelson is the commercial and industrial centre and port for a vast hinterland of fertile productive region noted for fruit growing and wine production. It has a mild and benevolent climate and has one of the highest amounts of sunshine in the country.

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Day 6 **BLenheim – Nelson (via Picton) – continued**

The most prominent building is Christ Church Cathedral which dominates the central city area. Also worth a visit is the Suter Art Gallery. Nelson has many old, preserved buildings including a magnificently restored two-storey cob house. There are many places of natural beauty around the city including good swimming beaches.

Day 7 **NELSON**

Today you will have a full day at leisure.

If you would like some suggestions for tours and activities in the area, please let us know as we have some suggestions on file.

Day 8 **NELSON – PUNAKAIKI**

This morning drive to Punakaiki, this will take approximately 3 hours, 30 minutes. It is 152 miles.

The West Coast is a beautiful part of our country and you without a doubt will find plenty of places to stop and take pictures today.

As you arrive in Punakaiki make your way to the Punakaiki Resort and check in.

Stay at: ***Punakaiki Resort in an Eco Room***
Includes; breakfast

Dramatic seascapes along the Punakaiki Coast culminate in the amazing stacks of giant pancake rock formations and booming blowholes.

Punakaiki is sited at the mouth of the Punakaiki River, 40 km north of Greymouth, on the West Coast. This small settlement is well set up for visitors with an information centre, tearooms, tavern, motels, lodges and a motor camp.

The Dolomite Point lookout above the famous pancake rocks, is a short walk from the road on a paved loop track. You will hear the booming surf long before you set eyes on the slender towers that have been weathered to resemble a huge stack of pancakes.

These strange formations are caused by a chemical process. Long ago layers of lime-rich mud were deposited on the seabed and then overlain by weaker sheets of soft mud and clay. The seabed was tilted and raised to form coastal cliffs, and wind and water have etched out the soft layers to produce the stark relief of stratified formations. The blowholes are the result of massive undermining of these weird structures by wave action. High seas surge into caverns, causing enough pressure to propel impressive geysers of spume and spray up through clefts in the rock.

Day 9 **PUNAKAIKI – FRANZ JOSEF GLACIER**

This morning drive to Franz Josef Glacier, this will take approximately 3 hours, 10 minutes. It is 138 miles.

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Day 9 **PUNAKAIKI – FRANZ JOSEF GLACIER – continued**

There are several charming towns to stop at as you continue your journey south including, Greymouth, which serves as the final stop for the TranzAlpine train which operates daily from and to Christchurch. Hokitika is also a great place to stop, it has become a colourful arts town specialising in Jade (or Pounamu in Maori) and a little gold which is part of the town's history from the Gold mining era.

Before you arrive in Franz Josef Glacier town Westwood Lodge will be on the left hand side of the main highway. It is located less than a mile north of the main town and there is a designated walking path, 15 minutes walk, which can take you to town if you do not want to drive.

Stay at: ***Westwood Lodge in an Mainhouse Room***
Includes; breakfast

The rugged West Coast is hemmed between the Tasman Sea and the imposing Southern Alps, making for spectacular contrasts in the surrounding scenery.

Franz Josef Glacier, found in the stunning Westland National Park, is one of the most spectacular glaciers in this region. Combine an awesome scenic helicopter flight over the glacier with a unique guided walk amongst the ice caves, pinnacles and seracs of this pristine, alpine environment. You'll see the extraordinary colours of the ice-flow from above and then up close, on an unforgettable guided walk.

Day 10 **FRANZ JOSEF GLACIER**

This morning you will check in for your Heli-hike tour.

The Helicopter line offers the Franz Josef Heli Hike in conjunction with Franz Josef Glacier Guides who have been operating since 1990 and can trace their heritage back 100 years. Your professional guide will lead you into the most spectacular icefall terrain that is usually seen only by experienced mountaineers. With a spotless safety record, rigid assessments, and using exclusive quality equipment, your safety and enjoyment is taken care of.

The rest of your day will be at leisure.

Day 11 **FRANZ JOSEF GLACIER**

Today will be a full day at leisure.

Hopefully you will have had wonderful weather for your Heli-hike yesterday. Today you may wish to take a drive to Fox Glacier and Lake Matheson.

At Lake Matheson, nature has combined exactly the right ingredients to create truly stunning reflections of New Zealand's highest peaks – Mount Cook (Aoraki in Maori) and Mount Tasman. On a calm day the dark brown waters of the lake create the ideal reflective surface. (A photographers dream).

The walk from the car park takes 40 minutes to the pontoon, or 1.5 hours around the lake.

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Day 12 FRANZ JOSEF GLACIER – WANAKA

This morning drive to Wanaka, this will take approximately 4 hours, 5 minutes. It is 178 miles.

Today your drive will include the Haast Pass with its waterfalls dropping from hanging valleys into glacial gorges. The journey continues, leaving beech forest and moving into tussock land as the road begins to descend in to skirts scenic Lake Wanaka.

As you arrive in Wanaka make your way to the Silver Pine Lodge and check in.

Stay at: ***Silver Pine Lodge in an Lodge Room***
Includes; dinner and breakfast

Lake Wanaka is located right at the heart of the southern lakes and is the gateway to the Mount. Aspiring National Park. It is internationally renowned for its glaciers and magnificent tramping and climbing. The mountains surrounding the lake provide a winter snow lovers paradise featuring top ski fields and heliski facilities and the town itself features a pretty shopping village with a wide variety of ambient areas to relax, eat and imbibe.

Day 13 WANAKA

Today you will have a full day at leisure.

At some stage today you may wish to take a drive to the town of Lake Wanaka and do some exploring.

Day 14 WANAKA – QUEENSTOWN

This morning drive to Queenstown, this will take approximately 1 hour, 45 minutes. It is 73 miles.

On arrival in Queenstown make your way to, Eichardt's Private Hotel, here you can store your bags and your vehicle (and possible check the dinner menu for later tonight).

Make your way to the Steamer Wharf, less than 5 minutes walk from your accommodation.

Check in at the Real Journey's office on the Steamer Wharf for your tour to Milford Sound. This tour departs at 12.00noon.

Flying over the Southern Alps between Queenstown and Milford is the ultimate way to experience southern New Zealand's dramatic alpine scenery.

A hidden landscape unfolds below, revealing glacial lakes, waterfalls, deep valleys and cloud-piercing summits.

The aircraft are specially selected for the mountainous terrain of Fiordland and Mount Aspiring National Parks. All the pilots are specifically trained for alpine flying and provide an informative commentary along the way.

On landing at the Milford Sound airstrip you are transferred to the harbour where you board your Scenic Cruise

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Day 14 **WANAKA – QUEENSTOWN** – continued

The Scenic Cruise vessels have purpose-built observation lounges and large decks, so you can be sure you'll get some great viewing and photo taking opportunities. Keep a look out for wildlife such as seals basking on the rocks.

A picnic lunch will be provided for your enjoyment while watching the scenery drift past.

During the cruise, the friendly crew provide commentaries in several languages and point out highlights such as Mitre Peak and the Pembroke Glacier.

At the conclusion of your cruise you will be transferred back to the Milford Sound Airstrip for your return flight to Queenstown.

On arrival at the Queenstown Airport you will be transferred to your accommodation.

Stay at: ***Eichardt's Private Hotel in a Super-king Suite***
Includes; breakfast

In a region of exceptional and diverse beauty, Queenstown, leading resort in the South Island, is regarded by inveterate world travellers as one of the premier scenic areas in the world.

Backed by steep mountains, Queenstown lies in the curve of Lake Wakatipu at the head of its own small horse-shoe shaped bay. It is the South Island's principal resort, drawing visitors the year round with its lake and mountain scenery, exhilarating climate, changing seasons and varied excursion possibilities.

The rest of your afternoon and evening is at leisure.

Day 15 **QUEENSTOWN**

You will need to have an early breakfast at your accommodation this morning before making your way back to the Real Journey's office on the Steamer Wharf.

Check in for your tour to Doubtful Sound, this departs at 6.55am.

When you discover Doubtful Sound you will be struck by its silence – a silence broken only by birdsong or the rushing of a distant waterfall.

The beauty and isolation of Doubtful Sound are so compelling that it's difficult to believe you were in civilisation just a few hours earlier.

A day excursion into this pristine fiord begins with a cruise across beautiful Lake Manapouri to West Arm. You will then board a coach and travel the sub-alpine road over Wilmot Pass, pausing along the way to experience the dense Fiordland rainforest and view Doubtful Sound glistening far below.

On arrival in Doubtful Sound, board our spacious catamaran Patea Explorer for a three-hour cruise through some of the fiord's most stunning scenery. Throughout the cruise, a specialist nature guide provides commentary, answers questions and points out highlights.

Wildlife sightings are common in Doubtful Sound. Fur seals bask on rocky outcrops and the fiord's resident pod of bottlenose dolphins are often seen roving through the deep, dark waters.

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Day 15 **QUEENSTOWN** – continued

A picnic lunch will be provided for your enjoyment while watching the scenery drift past.

At the conclusion of your cruise you will be collected from Deep Cove by Helicopter. The Helicopter flight is the ultimate way to view the spectacular alpine scenery including glaciers, rivers, lakes and rainforest.

The Helicopter will leave the fiord and take you on a scenic flight over the Kepler Mountains, the southern end of Lake Te Anau, Mavora Lakes and Vonn Valley before landing at Queenstown Airport.

On arrival at the Queenstown Airport you will be transferred to your accommodation (3 hours before the coach's return).

The rest of your afternoon and evening is at leisure.

Day 16 **QUEENSTOWN**

After breakfast at your accommodation make your way to the Queenstown Information Centre which is just a short walk from your accommodation.

Check in at the Dart River Jet Safari counter for your tour today. This is located in the Queenstown Info Centre located on the corner of Camp & Shotover Street.

Board your coach and depart Queenstown for Glenorchy and your tour.

Depart for Glenorchy at the head of Lake Wakatipu. Here, join the back-road bus for a drive through the remote rural landscapes of the Rees Valley. At the end of the road, undertake a short walk through ancient forests of the Mount Aspiring National Park to Chinaman's Bluff.

At this point guests will board a jet boat for a breathtaking scenic trip up the Dart River into the pristine country of the Mount Aspiring National Park. The jet boat is the only means of entering this wilderness area, and the number of passengers allowed to visit on a daily basis is strictly controlled by the Department of Conservation.

The Dart River Safari is more than a jet boat ride - it's a World Heritage eco-journey into the heart of wilderness New Zealand. Navigating deep into the alpine corridor of Mount Aspiring National Park, the challenging grandeur of the mountains and valleys will leave a lasting impression. Discover ice-capped mountains and glaciers, cascading waterfalls and crystal clear streams and pools, all while enjoying the thrill of being aboard a purpose-built jet boat.

Following the excursion, guests will transfer back to Queenstown.

The rest of your afternoon and evening is at leisure.

Day 17 **QUEENSTOWN – WELLINGTON – WHAREKAUHAU**

Today you will be at leisure until the appropriate time when you will return your vehicle to the Queenstown airport before boarding your flight (details to be advised).

On arrival in Wellington, you will collect your rental vehicle from the Wellington Airport Depot.

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Day 17 **QUEENSTOWN – WELLINGTON – WHAREKAUHAU – continued**

The drive to Wharekauhau Lodge is approximately 1 hour and 30 minutes.

NOTE: It is also possible to helicopter to the lodge and collect your rental car from here, please ask for the additional cost if this is of interest.

Stay at: ***Wharekauhau Lodge and Country Estate in a Cottage Suite***
Includes; gourmet dinner, pre-dinner drinks and canapés, full breakfast and complimentary non-alcoholic drinks/ tea and coffee/ fruits and baking.

The rest of your afternoon is at leisure before dinner at the lodge.

Day 18 **WHAREKAUHAU**

After breakfast this morning you will enjoy a Wharekauhau Farm Tour.

No visit to Wharekauhau is complete without a tour of the surrounding farm. Bordered by the Rimutaka Ranges and Pacific Ocean, this classic New Zealand Romney sheep station features all the activities that have created New Zealand's legendary farming heritage, including sheep shearing demonstrations, sheep dogs in action and daily farm events.

This working sheep station tour is an absolute must for all Wharekauhau Visitors. Explore the far reaches of the farm and surrounding forest in a comfortable late model 4-wheel drive vehicle.

At the conclusion of your farm tour you will get to enjoy a thrill ride on the ATV Quad bikes.

Ideal for the adventurous, these bikes are loads of fun. A great way to travel along the black sand beaches, over scenic riverbanks and along open fields. After 20 minutes of tuition, enjoy wonderful views and local scenery in the company of an experienced guide. Protective clothing is provided.

The rest of your afternoon is at leisure before dinner at the lodge.

Day 19 **WHAREKAUHAU – HAWKE'S BAY**

This morning drive to Hawke's Bay, this will take approximately 4 hours, 20 minutes. It is 185 miles.

Travel by way of Featherston, Greytown and Carterton before joining State Highway two, which you will stay on until you reach Hawke's Bay.

As you arrive in the Hawke's Bay region you will may your way to Hastings and Greenhill Lodge and check in.

Stay at: ***Greenhill Lodge in a King Room***
Includes; breakfast

The twin cities of Napier and Hastings, located within the region of Hawke's Bay on the East Coast of New Zealand's North Island, are quite unique.

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Day 19 **WHAREKAUHAU – HAWKE’S BAY** - continued

The area is blessed with a Californian-Mediterranean climate. The area is dotted with colourful vineyards and orchards, with some of the most fertile farmland you will see.

In 1931 a two and a half minute earthquake destroyed the city of Napier. Rebuilding began almost immediately in the architectural style of the time - Art Deco. Napier is now classed as the newest city in the world, offering a marvellous, world-renown, collection of Art Deco buildings.

Within the region are more than twenty of New Zealand’s finest vineyards, many of which are open to the public. The Hastings area is often referred to as the “Fruitbowl of New Zealand.” Among the attractions in the area are the Gannet Colony at Cape Kidnappers, the Hawke’s Bay Aquarium, the Spanish Mission and Art Deco architecture, gardens and bush walks.

The rest of your afternoon and evening is at leisure.

Day 20 **HAWKE’S BAY**

Today will be a full day at leisure.

You may wish to visit some of the award winning wineries of this region today, if you wish to do this as part of the tour please let us know as we would be happy to make suggestions.

Day 21 **HAWKE’S BAY – TAUPO**

This morning drive to Taupo, this will take approximately 2 hours, 30 minutes. It is 100 miles.

On arrival in Taupo make your way to, Huka Lodge (10 minutes north of the town), here you can store your bags and your vehicle before proceeding to the Helipad.

NOTE: It is suggested that you stop for lunch in Lake Taupo.

Board your Helicopter for an exclusive tour of White Island and Mt. Tarawera.

Helicopter to White Island and land for an approx. 1-hour guided walk in the crater of New Zealand’s most active volcano. White Island was once home to workers who mined the island for sulphur, and remains of this activity are still visible today. This 3.5-hour trip takes you from Huka Lodge via the Waikato River on to White Island, 25 miles off the Bay of Plenty coast. During your trip you will also have the exclusive opportunity of a breathtaking landing on the summit of Mt. Tarawera, a dormant volcano that last erupted in 1886. Closed and sturdy footwear is recommended. Landing is dependent on weather and levels of volcanic activity.

When you return to the lodge you will be checked in and shown to your room.

Stay at: ***Huka Lodge in a Lodge Room***
Includes; pre-dinner drinks, a five-course dinner and full country-style breakfast. Plus use of all Lodge facilities

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Day 21 HAWKE'S BAY – TAUPO - continued

Situated in the volcanic heart of the North Island, the Lake Taupo region is home to New Zealand's largest fresh water lake, fascinating geothermal areas and the famous Huka Falls.

Visitors come for the scenery and action-packed adventure, which are accompanied by a genuinely friendly local culture. The lakeside community is alive with great places to eat, drink and party.

Lake Taupo's geothermal attractions include geysers, steaming craters and boiling mud pools. Other special experiences include the walk to Huka Falls, a game of golf at Wairakei and kayaking to the Maori carvings at Mine Bay.

The rest of your afternoon is at leisure before dinner at the lodge.

Day 22 TAUPO

Today will be a full day at leisure.

You may wish to take some time to relax and enjoy the lodge environment.

Day 23 TAUPO – AUCKLAND (VIA ROTORUA) – WAIHEKE ISLAND

The drive to Auckland takes approximately 4 hours. It is 173 miles. We suggest that you leave early to allow some time in Rotorua before you continue north.

You should aim to leave Rotorua by 1.00pm to allow enough time to return your rental Vehicle and transfer to the Waiheke Island ferry. From Rotorua you should allow 3 hours and 30 minutes.

Once you have returned your vehicle to the Auckland City Depot you will be transferred to the Ferry Terminal.

The ferry sailings depart frequently and take 35 minutes to cross the Hauraki Gulf.

On arrival you will be met by lodge staff and transferred to your accommodation.

Stay at: ***Delamore Lodge in a King Room***

Includes; pre dinner drinks and hors d'oeuvres, 4 course dinner and gourmet breakfast.

Waiheke Island is a picturesque blend of farmland, forest, beaches, vineyards and olive groves. Located in the Hauraki Gulf of New Zealand, it is only 35 minutes by ferry from downtown Auckland. There is a great range of activities on Waiheke including sightseeing, mountain biking, sea kayaking, vineyard & winery tours and much more.

Tonight enjoy dinner at the lodge.

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Day 24 WAIHEKE ISLAND

This morning after a leisurely breakfast you will be collected from your accommodation for an exclusive tour of Waiheke Island.

Your tour today will be at your discretion and you can see and do only the things you want to. It will be concluded with lunch at one of the local winery restaurants before you are transferred back to your accommodation.

The rest of your afternoon is at leisure before dinner at the lodge.

Day 25 WAIHEKE ISLAND – AUCKLAND – DEPART

Your time is free until the appropriate time when lodge staff will transfer you to the Waiheke Ferry.

Following the 35 minute ferry to Auckland you will be met and transferred to the Auckland International Airport for your departure flight.

Depart Auckland on flight to be advised.
